Lord Hillsborough humbly asks Your Majesty's pardon for having postponed the private Letter Your Majesty was pleased to command ^{him} to write yesterday to the Lord Lieutenant in relation to Ireland being inserted in the Marine, Mutiny Bill, but the Paper which he has now the honour to send to your Majesty and which arrived late last night induced him to think, it would be best to mention the whole of the Subject together, especially as the Parliament of Ireland is adjourned. If your Majesty thinks proper, Lord Hillsborough will lay the Lord Lieutenant's Dispatches before the Cabinet to day, they appear to be of the utmost importance, and to require the most mature and at the same time the most speedy Consideration, and that Lord Chancellor may be as well informed as time will permit Lord Hillsborough proposes to send them to his Lordship so soon as they shall be returned from your Majesty.
