towards His Majesty's service that they
have an assurance for his health and permanent
restoration to health. I trust in God I shall
to have the pleasure of seeing my brother in
that state of firm fortitude which
will enable him very shortly to receive
at the Castle the due help and myself.

I need hardly add that I hope
you will inform me of the King's health and
I do most anxiously wish by your accounts may
