I did not imagine last night that there was time sufficient to apprise the Boards of Treasury



and Admiralty so as for them to  
kiss hands to day. I have how-  
ever acquainted Lord Rockingham  
of what your Majesty suggested  
yesterday, that Writs can be mov'd  
upon a declaration of acceptance,  
but if any of them wish to kiss  
hands to day, I will take care  
to send your Majesty another  
copy of the Incho'd List, with  
their names added in due time.
