



Lord Shelburne, as well as writing to Lord Jersey has I trust wrote to  
Lord Aylesbury and Lord Rivers concerning their Lieutenancies. I shall  
certainly be on Wednesday in Town for the presentation of those who  
are still to come into Office, but I repeat it I trust I am to be apprised  
by Lord Shelburne of the conclusion of those Arrangements not  
through any other Channel.

The Obstinacy of Lord Howe is not any thing new, Lord Shelburne  
is very discreet in letting Admiral Stappell be the negotiator  
between him and the V. of Richmond, as I am certain it will be
