From a good deal of conversation which I have had since I attended your Majesty, I cannot help submitting to your Majesty, whether it might not be more convenient to say to Lord Rockingham what your Majesty has committed to writing, considering your Majesty has prepared the words, and will

have them in your possession. It ap-
-pears an object to protract this Dis-
-cussion at a time when Light is wan-
-ing, which a short time may pro-
-duce.
