I beg to explain the circumstances relative to the charge of £137. for Plate, and which the Certificate afforded by Mr General Wetherall and myself, it is possible, did not sufficiently elucidate. The fact is simply this:— Before Her Royal Highness's marriage with His late Royal Highness she made a will with his sanction, in which this Plate was disposed of. However it being then useful to the Duke to fashion it after that he had, he gave a declaration that he would replace it. His Royal Highness's non-return to Amorbach prevented this being done; and it was conceived better by The Duke's's Lewants to avoid withdrawing an equivalent of Plate for her, but merely to charge that sum it was valued at per oz; although thereby Her Royal Highness would lose considerably in restoring things to their original position. This explanation will show that the Plate in question was not vested in His Royal Highness by marriage.

Upon the other Items, having already finally arranged

arranged them I am persuaded the administrators  
will see the difficulty in bringing them again under  
disruption.

Your favor of the 29<sup>th</sup> ulto did not reach us till near 9 o'clock in the evening of the following day consequently not until after the meeting of the Committee had taken place who were very much disappointed at not having seen you & not having received any communication to our letter of the 25<sup>th</sup> ulto which was written to you by their direction.

If you will be so good as to refer to our letter of the 13<sup>th</sup> of July 1821 requesting the favor of your calling on us respecting the accounts between H<sup>rs</sup> The Duchess of Kent & the Administrators of H<sup>rs</sup> late R<sup>ts</sup> The Duke of Kent you will find that the Committee & Administrators did not then consider those accounts finally closed but we have not had the pleasure of seeing you since that letter was written & you will no doubt recollect that at the time you & Mr Crealock met with a view to the arrangement of the incidental account between The Duchess and the

Administrators Mr Crealock expressly stated that it would be subject to the final approval of the Committee and Administrators. It is a pity that the sums mentioned in your letter were not at first included in the list of the Sidmouth debts as you are no doubt aware that the Fund out of which those debts were paid is pledged by the express directions of the Illustrious Individual who created that fund to the payment of a Debt due to Mr Alderman Waithman should there be sufficient for the purpose on the final settlement of the affairs.

There is no doubt but that the Articles of Plate valued at £137 referred to in your letter became the Property of His late Royal Highness on his marriage & that The Duchess legally has no right to retain these Articles or their Value as against the Administrators or H. R. H's Creditors but as we know there is no wish on the part of the Committee or the Administrators that the Duchess should pay one farthing more than she is obliged to do we should be glad if you would favor us with a call in the Course of a few days in order that we may see if some plan cannot be devised
