Moira was authorised to express, His Majesty proposes to  
receive His Royal Highness at Kew on Wednesday next at  
twelve o'clock. His Majesty has been pleased to intimate  
in the Communication, with which he has honoured the Lord  
Chancellor, his Pleasure that, upon receiving His Royal  
Highness's Visit, no retrospect should take place.

The Lord Chancellor humbly takes leave to add that,  
though no Caution could be blameable, which had for its Object  
the Preservation of His Majesty's Health after it was restored,  
the continued exertion of that Caution may have prevented a  
Communication of this Nature at an earlier Period, as His  
Majesty appears to have been pleased to think that the most  
proper Time for making it would be after such

Interview with His Physicians, as His Majesty had on  
Saturday last.

The Lord Chancellor begs to offer his Duty to His Royal Highness the Prince  
of Wales, and he requests His Royal Highness to do him the Justice to  
believe that it is with the most sincere Regret that he finds him-  
self unable to obey His Royal Highness's Commands, at the House he  
mentions. He most humbly requests His Royal Highness to per-  
mit him to mention that he is under an Engagement which  
His Royal Highness, he trusts, will induce him Graciously to feel  
that the Chancellor cannot postpone, that is, to be present at His  
Elders Son's Marriage, and the Chancellor is afraid that no  
Arrangement, which it is in his power to make, will enable him to  
obey His Royal Highness's Commands, before half past Ten, or quarter  
before Eleven o'Clock; But the moment he can come down to Carlton  
House the Chancellor will attend His Royal Highness, and he  
humbly hopes for this Indulgent Consideration in the very peculiar  
circumstances in which he is placed.
