W Pitt respectfully begs leave to acquaint

As His Royal Highness does not appear
to have been fully aware that the Paper
transmitted to him by The Lord Chancellor
was a Communication made directly to His

Royal Highness by The King's express commands,
Mr Pitt would at all events have felt it his
duty to defer acquainting His Majesty with
the commands he has received from The Prince,
till His Royal Highness's attention had been
called to that circumstance. But,
independent of this consideration, He must
entreat His Royal Highness's Permission to
state that He is very far from feeling
himself completely informed by his conversations

with the end of honor of the whole of
His Royal Highness's Dispositions and
Resolutions, especially in reference to a
Communication from His Majesty made
subsequently to those Conventions; and
that without a more precise and positive
Intimation of the Sentiments which His
Royal Highness wishes to be conveyed, it
is impossible for Mr Pitt to undertake
to make any representation whatever

to His Majesty on so delicate and important
a Subject.
