Chancellor

The point upon which the Prince rests is this. That it is requisite the arrangement should be entirely between the King & him. And that the Prince of Wales ought not to have, or appear to have, any interference in it.

This of course is not understood to affect Her Majesty's Pleasure as to any communication he may think fit to make to the Prince. The Prince has not the most distant notion of preventing the Prince of Wales from having all the intercourse with Princess Charlotte which Her Royal Highness has hitherto held. nor does Her Royal Highness object to her residence in the House prepared at Windsor on her occasional visits there, provided such residence be not so long as to countenance the idea which the Prince wishes to avoid.
