The King has signed the warrant for
having the Establishment of the Principality of Wales and
entirely approves of the Addition made to it by Lord Grenville of
£1000 per Annum for uniform Charges and of the Provision
left for such further Additions as may be necessary. — His
Majesty will not fail to speak to General Gough and hopes
he may succeed in procuring upon Miss Gough to accept
the Situation of Sub Governor, but if she should still persist
in declining it, the King will wait for such further
Proposals as may be made to him by the Officers of
Wales for filling that Situation.

His Majesty regrets very much
that Lord Grenville still suffers so much Inconvenience
from his Accident and fears that he did not do himself
any good by coming out last week.
