Sir

honour of writing to Her Majesty by
the Messengers yesterday night. I take
the liberty of sending your royal
highness Her Majesty's very gracious
& kind letter, as far as relates to
myself, & I will not give up the
hope of the Queen's being forgiving
& kind enough to relent towards

good & accomplished Miss Thynne
one day or other. I have taken the
liberty of inclosing the letter that
was mispent to your service, & wish it
had produced a more favourable
effect, than it seems to have done
upon Her Majesty's mind, but it must
be left by God's blessing to Miss Thynne,
but Her Majesty should feel so much
regret at parting with her. I received
these letters after my return from
Warwick House last night, & took
them in my pocket to Lady Astley,
hoping to deliver them to your
Majesty next week. I cannot
