Tomorrow, I wish it were possible  
to be with you at the dinner  
even, that we might all be  
once together - I spent a very  
happy day on Tuesday, because  
I was with you that whole day  
I wish for many weeks  
I must let you know that  
I have not been able to do  
two last days, & that he has  
convinced me to perfection, and  
that came from your letter  
of the 21st: you were kind  
to have prepared for me  
I hope I must be quite  
recovered & that you have  
not been prevented seeing  
with much pleasure that  
forward to seeing you soon.
