Lady Poplyn is commanded by the Queen, to impart to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, a conversation with which Her Majesty has been pleased to honor Lady Poplyn on the subject of Her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte: the substance of which is, as follows.

That His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, has done Lady Poplyn the honor to propose, that she shall take a situation about Her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte, in conjunction with the Dowager Lady Richester and Mrs Campbell. - That in order to render every thing as easy to them as so responsible a situation

situation requires, that His Royal Highness, will have the goodness to give them his commands under his own hand, from which they are to pledge themselves, that they will in no instance voluntarily swerve.

Lady Pepslyn understands from Her Majesty, that His Royal Highness requires, that Princess Charlotte, shall have one of Her Ladies in constant attendance on Her Royal Highness, and so sleep in the same room with Her.

That neither letter or parcel shall be given to Princess Charlotte, except, that letter, or parcel shall come directed under cover to one of Her Royal Highnesses Ladies, and delivered by them.

Highly as Lady Pepslyn is flattered by
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His Royal Highness The Prince Regent, good
 opinion, she nevertheless thinks it right to
 state to His Royal Highness, that she is fearful
 that she may not be agreeable to Princess Charlotte;
 in which case, she cannot be of that use to
 Her Royal Highness, that she would wish. But,
 under the present circumstances, Lady Rosslyn
 is willing to do any thing within the compass
 of her power, to prove her duty, and attachment
 to His Royal Highness, and to His Family.
 Lady Rosslyn accepts the honor of the
 situation proposed to her, till, His Royal Highness
 shall have found some Lady to supply her
 place, with whom His Royal Highness shall be
 satisfied.
