Lady Roper is commanded by the Queen to
impart to H.R.H. the Prince Regent, a Commission
with which Her Majesty has been pleased to honor
Lady Roper on the Subject of H.R.H. the Prince
Charlotte, — the Substance of which is as follows.

That H.R.H. the Prince Regent has
done Lady Roper the honor to propose, that
she shall take a Situation about H.R.H. the
Prince Charlotte, in Conjunction with the
Courage Lady Chester & Mrs Campbell.
That in order to render every thing as easy
to them, as so responsible a Situation
requires, that H.R.H. will have the goodness
to give them His Commands under His own
hand, from which Commands they are to
pledge themselves that they will, in His Majesty's
voluntary service.

Lady Roper understands from Her
Majesty that H.R.H. requires that Prince
Charlotte, shall have one of Her Ladies in

in constant Attendance on H. H., and to sleep in
the same Room with her.

That neither Letter on Bural shall be
given to Princip Charlotte, except, that Letter on
Bural shall come directed under cover to one of
H. H.'s Ladies, and delivered by them.

Highly as Lady Roplyn is flattered
by H. H. the Prince Regent's good Opinion,
she nevertheless thinks it right to state to H. H.,
that she is fearful that she may not be agreeable
to Princip Charlotte, in which case, she cannot
be of that Use to H. H. that she could wish;
But, under the present Circumstances, Lady
Roplyn is wishing to do every thing within
the Compass of her Power, to prove her Obedy, and
Attachment to H. H. & to his Family.

Lady Roplyn accepts the Honor
of the Situation proposed to her, till H. H.
shall have found some Lady to supply her
Place, with whom H. H. shall be satisfied.

One thing Lady Roplyn takes the

the Liberty to add; That, apprehensive as
she must naturally be, of the not meeting
H.M.'s wishes in every respect, she would
humbly request, that the Plans which H.M.
intends to establish might be commenced under
H.M.'s own Roof, and under his immediate
Direction, — without which His Royal Highness
must forgive Lady Repyris declining it.
