Dr Baillie has the honour of informing the Prince Regent most respectfully that Princess Charlotte's departure for Weymouth is now fixed for the 9th Inst — Dr B. was surpris'd at this delay but he learnt upon enquiry that some circumstances in Her Royal Highness's periodical health render'd it advisable that she should not undertake the journey immediately, and that if Her Royal Highness had been at Weymouth, she could not have made use of the tepid Sea water Bath for some days —

It does not appear necessary that Mr Keate should reside constantly at Weymouth while Princess Charlotte remains there, but it would be advisable that he should examine the Prince occasionally — It would probably be enough that Mr Keate should go to Weymouth once in ten days, and remain there about two days — He is

ready to give a more constant attendance
if the Prince Regent should wish it
- Dr Baillie proposes to go to Gloucester
shire the week after next, and after
remaining there about eight or ten
days he proposes to pay a visit to
Princess Charlotte at Weymouth for
one or two days, if this shall meet
with the Prince-Regent's approbation

- Dr Baillie was exceedingly hurt

News Papers - He has made every
enquiry into the Channel by which it
was communicated, but he has not
yet obtained answers from two of
the most important quarters. When
