Highness complains of distension
of the Stomach from indigestion, but
has much less of the feeling of con-
striction in Her Chest, than She had
a few weeks ago —

It has been agreed upon with
Mr Robt Keate that the tempe-
rature of the Bath should be
considerably lower'd at the two
next bathings, and if Her Royal
Highness shall feel advantage from
this change, it is propos'd that
She shall go into the open Sea —
Her Royal Highness is to be per-
mitted to take a short walk daily,
which Mr Robt Keate thinks will
now rather be useful to the Knee

Dr Baillie is to see Princess Char-

immediately he leaves Weymouth
