

The appearances which were observed on inspecting the Body of Her late Royal Highness The Princess Charlotte of Wales. the Seventh of November 1817.

The Membranes of the Brain had their natural appearance. The Vessels of Pia Mater were less distended with Blood, than was to be expected after so severe a Labour.

The Ventricles of the Brain contained very little fluid.

The Plexus Choroides was of a pale colour, & the substance of the Brain had its natural texture.

The Pericardium contained two oz.^{ss} of red coloured fluid; the Heart itself
and

and the Lungs were in a natural state.
The Stomach contained nearly three Pints
of Liquid. The Colon was distended with
Air.

The small Intestines, Spleen, Pancreas,
& Kidneys were in a healthy state.

The Uterus contained a considerable
quantity of coagulated Blood, & extended
as high as the Navel, & the Hour Glass
contraction was still very apparent.

The Right Ovarium was formed into a
Cyst the size of a Hens Egg, distended
with Serum, & a Mass of Sebaceous
Matter, the Left Ovarium was in a
healthy state.

The Urinary Bladder was empty &
in a sound condition.

nine Pounds - every part of its in-
