Nothing can be more proper than the ready manner in which Lord Shelburne has brought the decision on Peace or War to a fixed point. Three o'clock will be a very proper hour for holding the Privy Council this day for proroguing the Parliament which will prevent any gambling in the Alley this Day, and if the Lord Mayor gets the letter by eleven this night there will be time to prevent ~~that~~ ~~consequences~~ might it not be proper for one of the Secretaries of the Treasury to write the same intimation to the Bank and the East Company which will spread the account still faster.

The letter from Mr. Vaughan shews that France is sincere. I still think St. Lucia and Martinique would sound better than Guadaloupe and Dominique.
