Lord Grantham is perfectly right in losing no time in calling a meeting this Morning on the French and Spanish Propositions, however unreasonable Mr. Duke's naval maybe ordered to be in trying to make us yield all the ease, yet I trust he has secret directions to give way rather than not have Peace, as Count de Vergennes would never have let him be accompanied by his son; but I should be mistaken in my suggestion as to doing every thing, but letting them return to Paris to mend the Treaty, I think Peace so essential and that the dreadful Resolution of the 27th of February last of the House of Commons has so entirely removed the real Cause of the War to the utter Shame of that Branch of the Legislature, that it would be madness not to conclude Peace on the best possible terms we can obtain
