or place my private Letters and papers
in the hands of my Eldest Son or whomsoever
I chuse - I shall therefore do so as soon
as they can be copied - I have only to
remark that in respect to the Boony
no communication was ever made to
me, it was made to my Son - and
he can best answer what mistakes
have arisen - Alas Dear Sir, he relied
upon what was said to him - I was doubtful
but no matter - I shall forward your
Letter to Mr Spontledge directly

And I cannot but lament it is so little
Satisfactory - as I must conclude you would
not have undertaken to have given such
an answer, without consulting those
whose duty it is to give advice to the Crown.
My letters and papers, I hope will go before
the House of Lords from some Member of
Parliament - and in that course I trust
the ends of Justice may be obtained -
at all events I shall have the satisfaction
of feeling I have done my duty - and never
lost sight of affection and respect to the
Royal Family -
