Mr Adam saw Lady Berkeley by  
The Prince's Command to converse over  
with Her the Matter which had reference  
to the Communications made by Lord Berkeley  
at different times to His Royal Highness.  
After repeated interviews with Her Lady:  
ship and Communications to The Prince  
Mr Adam reduced the substance of  
what The Prince recollect'd to writing  
A copy was given to Lady Berkeley, and  
The original deposited in The Duke's Office  
to preserve it & to ascertain that it  
flow'd from The Prince.

The Communications made to Lady  
Salisbury and Others were not known  
to Mr Adam till His return from Scotland  
in the end of 1812. — The desire being

Lady Berkeley to have the communication made to the Chancellor & the question being raised again in the House of Lords on the Prince's Evidence — I was much surprised with Lady Berkeley by Mr Adams — I Mr Foxtham being present at the Disruption out of which this correspondence with Mr Adams arose — not at all referred to by Lady Berkeley in these papers — But most important <sup>in</sup> the Consideration of what is now aimed at by Her Ladyship —

This correspondence with the other papers on this subject are in Col. Macneil's keeping.
