Lord Halifax most dutifully begs Leave to acquaint his Majesty that on the Receipt of a Letter from Lord Sandwich he came to Town yesterday Evening, & went immediately with Lord Sandwich to My Lord Chancellors; where nothing was positively agreed on, but that a Meeting of his Majesty's principal Servants should be held this Morning at Bedford House at Twelve oth Clock.

Lord Sandwich & Halifax after their Return from My Lord Chancellors had a Conversation with the Attorney General, who expressed his Satisfaction at the Meeting appointed for today, & thinks it will be proper that a Privy Council should afterwards be Summon'd. He said no Demand could be offer'd to a Person of the French Ambassador in consequence of the Bill of Excommunication found, as he can remove the Cause by Certiorari into another Court, & that his Majesty, if it shall be thought proper may grant a *habeas corpus*
