The Queen having
been prevented sending you the Letter
which she began to write Yesterday as
the King desired her to go out a sailing
this Morning, she ordered me to express
to you my dear Brother how truly
concerned she is, at it's being out of her
power to return you sooner than
tomorrow her thanks for your very
interesting account of Madame de
Noailles and her Child. I never read
any thing that struck me more
than the History of her escape. Indeed
nothing can be so dreadful as the

affair of that unfortunate Country
the poor Queen appears to me to be
the person the most to be feared for
at this moment, I dread that
Monsieur d'Affaris's shameful declaration
should prove a tool in the hands of
her wicked Enemies to deprive her of
her life which they have so long sought
in vain to effect. Thank God that
their odious principles have not spread
on this side the Water, I think that
they must defeat their own plans
by pushing them on with such
violence as it opens every body's Eyes.
