 Frigate remaining for the Ladies I have

 one as I should reproach myself were  
 any accident to happen to them as they  
 have shewn me so much attention.

I hope your Majesty will excuse any  
 incorrectness in this Letter as I am still  
 so giddy and faint that I can scarce see  
 the Prince wanted to write instead of  
 me but I own I flattered myself that  
 your Majesty would rather hear from
