 follow us so this I consented as he pretended his
 home lay in that road but when we changed
 Horses and I found he still accompanied us
 I desired he would give himself no further
 trouble as our Spring was very strong but this

They told my Servants that at Minden it was known that eighty French were at Fritzlar and that he had posted twelve of his Men across in the Road which in case of the least disturbance would have instantly assisted in carrying me back to Minden. I have made Madame de Spiegel write to Baron Hanstein that he may in my name return thanks to these people for their care and attention which will ever make me doubly attached to the Hanoverians.

We arrived here thank God without any accident Yesterday Evening and I return your Majesty thanks for having ordered your Hanoverian Minister to meet me at Hanou.
I am happy that where ever I go I meet

some of your Majesty's subjects who out of duty
to you show me attention.

I will not trespass further on your Majesty's
time than to assure you how sincerely I am
devoted to you and that I am with the
greatest respect.
