Your Majesty and the Queen are the
Healths constantly drunk at Dinner and
that you are both spoke of in a manner

I wish that Your Majesty could see
this Country as I think that you
would be delighted not only with its
beauty but the spirit of industry that
reigns here universally the Rain has
done a great deal of harm which is
dreadful as both the Corn and Cereals
were more fruitful than the six
foregoing Years however if Providence
will but stop this sad Weather we may
still have great Plenty. I saw much
struck with the height of the Corn
and with the Osen and Cows of which I
saw a very great number in three Stables
at Hohenheim they are as large as the
great one we saw last Year. I enquired
whether they were always housed and

they told me that the keeping them constantly
in a Stable they grew bigger and are more
profitable on account of the Dung?

his humble duty to Your Majesty. I
take the liberty to enclose a letter from
the Duke and have the Honour to be
