Hearing that it is uncertain when
the Messenger will leave Frankfurt I
take the liberty to write again to Your
Majesty as I should be sorry not to appear
as anxious to recall myself to you as my
affection and respect lead me to do, and
indeed it is out of discretion that I do
not more frequently trouble Your Majesty
with Letters.

We received Yesterday from Monsieur
de Mademois the Prussian Minister an

account of the King having died on the
16 of November. I regret that he finished
his life as he had lived without becoming
more serious. It makes one shudder to
think of the death of a Man who has
lead so bad a life. God shewed him mercy
in allowing him to linger so long and as
the Almighty alone can judge the Heart
I trust that he repented. I hear the
Prince Royal feels his death very
much but still more how dreadful the
present times are to begin to reign.
Every body is anxious to see the
Effect this alteration will make.
