my pen will have great difficulty

Heart. Your Majesty who knows
my dutiful attachment will not
be surpris'd when I assure you
that I was more affected by the
account of the danger you had
been in, than with our own mis-
fortunes. The Duke begs me to
present his humble duty to Your
Majesty and Congratulations on
Your having been preserved in

so wonderful a manner, he would
 have written himself had he not
 feared the being troublesome. He
 joins with me most heartily in
 thanking the Almighty for watching
 over your precious life, and in
 praying God to grant that you
 may continue many many years
 a blessing to the world and doubly
 so to your Children who owe you
 every thing, and are proud to
 look up to you as their Parent
 and Protector.

The Situation here continues
 very uncertain: some days ago
 the French made a feint retreat
 and have taken up another
 position: they attacked Gurrabourg

where the Bavarians and Württemberg
are and were repulsed for the time
our men behaved very well and
I trust will continue to give
Your Majesty satisfaction. I
long to have a safe opportunity
to write as I have many things
to say which I cannot trust
by the post. I must now
take my leave with great
respect and remain
