Your Majesty's acceptance

The Weather is now very fine
and I am impatient to go to
Louisbourg but the Fates prevent
our going till the 1st of next

Month when I hope to employ
myself very much with my
Garden. The Duke has made
great additions to his Grounds
and every day finds means to
improve them. A Wittemberger
who has been in England has
brought over the Models of many
different Machines which the
Duke has had copied and
introduced with Success into
his Farms.

I was very much hurt to hear
of the Queen and my Sisters

having been unwell but flatter
myself that the fine Spring
will do them all good and quite
set up Mary who from not
being strong grows easily languid
after a short confinement.

The alterations Your Majesty
has made at Windsor must
improve the Castle very much
and I am convinced that in a
few years it will be the finest
building in its style in Europe
We have here a pretty good
Architect but he will require
