Those who are sincerely attached to the Prince Regent wish him to weigh very seriously the subject before he fixes on a Husband for Princess Charlotte. As the Character and disposition of that Prince is of high importance not only to the happiness of the Princess but to the Prince Regent and to the whole Royal Family. Should the Prince Regent choose a Prince who has already connections in England it is to be feared he may be drawn to try to make himself a party, and instead of acknowledging that he owes every thing to the Prince of Wales seek to stand on his own Legs - Therefore I should humbly presume that the best choice the Regent could make would be a Prince of our old House but who had very little of his own and would

Therefore remain dependant on him. Nothing
I dread so much as a Prince in imitation
of King William 3^d (who is now cited up
in every Newspaper as the only example
a King ought to follow) seeking to set himself
at the head of opposition and by degrees
looking forwards to set the future Queen
aside and reign alone. — I should not
have taken the liberty to give my sentiments
on this subject did not the House of
Orange speak openly of a Marriage being
already agreed on between Prince
Charlotte and the Hereditary Prince of
Orange. The Character he has obtained
in Spain and his having been educated
in England will of course give him a
party and make him more dangerous
than a total foreigner. The Hereditary
