My dear Brother

Having just heard from
Adolphus that Prince Charlotte has been
confirmed I should feel to appear wanting
in affection to you did I not express the
sincere wishes I form that this Ceremony
may have made a deep impression on her
mind; and that the serious reflections she
will have made in preparing herself for her
Confirmation may through life induce her
to act constantly in a manner that may
please you and contribute to your joint
happiness. — I do not intend to take
up your time by a long letter but cannot
deny myself the pleasure of wishing you
Joy of the success the British Army has
met with in Spain and of the unexpected

restoration of the Prince of Orange. The best
Year having finished so well I hope that
this will happily terminate all your great
Plans and that before its end you will
dear Brother be enabled to give Europe a
glorious and lasting Peace.

Nothing has given me more pleasure of late
than hearing that you had appointed dear
Adolphus Governor of Hanover, he was ever
victorious in the Electorate and I am sure
will do every thing in his power to restore
order and quiet in that poor Country which
has suffered much of late Years.

The King desires me to present his affectionate
