My dearest Brother

The uneasiness I have gone through concerning my Mother whose health I feared would suffer from receiving the account of the Death of her Brother Prince Ernest; was much increased by my anxiety about you; for though my Sisters assured me dear Brother that your indisposition was of no consequence the Newspapers alarmed me by saying you had been obliged to have recourse to bleeding, which I recollect formerly had been too often the case, these frequent bleedings having at one time weakened you very much. May I beg my dearest Brother that you will have the

goodness to make some body write me one  
line that I may know the real truth  
about your health as I am too sincerely  
attached to you not to be fearful.

I am glad to hear that Sir Thomas  
Sydney is arrived in England I believe he  
will feel very happy to be quietly seated by  
the fire side at Carlton House where I  
hope he will sometimes talk over Stuttgart  
and mention a variety of little things which  
can only be interesting to you out of  
handness to me - My dearest Brother

I will now take up no more of your  
time but only add the kindest Compliments  
and remain with the sincerest Affection
