This Month has overthrown the overgrown
power of Napoleon which certainly
would have enslaved Europe if the Allies
had failed in their great Enterprise. Your
Generous Heart dear Brother must feel
delighted to have restored the Crown of
France to its ancient Sovereigns, I trust
the Bourbons will never forget what
you have done for them and that they
will ever be grateful to England for the
great things it has done in their favour.
