England without troubling you with a
few lines to recall myself to you and
to renew the assurances of my affection
and friendship.

It gave me pleasure to hear my
dear Brother that you had spent some
months at Brighton, trusting that Sea
air will have done your health good

and prevent your having any returns of
the gout thro winter.

Being ever anxious about every thing
that concerns you, it gives me heart felt
satisfaction to find that all unite
in saying that Princess Charlotte is
much improved within the last six
months; God grant that this may
continue, and that she may become
daily a source of comfort and pleasure
to You.

I should fear to appear indiscreet
were I to indulge myself in conversing
longer with You. I therefore will
