Louisbourg August 21<sup>st</sup>, 1715.

My dearest Brother,

I hope you have received several Letters which I have addressed to you of late, and particularly that of 8<sup>th</sup> ult<sup>mo</sup> in which I took the liberty to have recourse to your kindness, in entreating you to give me a little pecuniary assistance. I am sincerely grieved my dearest Brother to be under the necessity of troubling you so often on a subject, which is painful to my Heart and assure you that I should be silent were I the only sufferer: but think it a duty to put aside my private feelings on this occasion, as the Laps I have met with do not only fall on myself, but on those

who have advanced me money, which I have  
no hopes to repay soon unless you are pleas'd  
Brother so good as to order the sums which  
I have never received to be reimburs'd to me,  
as also to have my pension hereafter constantly  
paid at full.

Not to torment you more than is absolutely  
necessary dear Brother I have written to your  
Ministers, knowing that notwithstanding your  
affection for me: as Regent; you would think  
it right to consult them. I enclose the Papers  
I sent you last year with the  
additional list of the last Quarters that  
you may see the extent of my losses  
I pray dear Brother forgive this scrawl and  
think with indulgence of my straitened
