Louisbourg May 10th 1816

Sir

It was not my intention to have troubled you so soon with another Letter; but I unfortunately find myself obliged to have recourse to you; and beg you will be so good Sir, as to assist me to pay off part of the money which I was under the necessity of borrowing, during the time we were cut off from all communication with Great Britain. If I can trust to any Memory you mentioned last year having over four thousand pounds in your hands; should this prove true, I hope you will not think me indiscreet in having drawn for one thousand pounds in addition to the thousand pounds of the Lady de la Quinte. I hope Sir that you are too well acquainted with my manner of acting not to

be convinced that necessity alone had induced
me to take the step of drawing on you
before I had written to acquaint you of
this intention. On one side I am much
press'd to refund the Sum I have borrowed
and on the other the course for the moment
being in favour of the Continent it is my
duty to try in a proper manner to clear
off my debts - I must therefore beg that
you will be so obliging as to order this
thousand pounds or also the Lady day Sum
to be paid to the Royal Bank of Stuttgart
I will now take up no more of your time
and remain Sir with regard and esteem
