M<sup>r</sup>. Secretary Townshend has acted very proper in sending the Orders that were necessary to the Admiralty on account of the Mutiny in the 77<sup>th</sup> Reg<sup>t</sup>. I trust He has acquainted Gen. Conway with the Steps he has taken, who will undoubtedly send such Orders as may oblige the delinquent Men to return to their Duty.

The case of D<sup>r</sup>. Magenise is too serious to be decided without knowing the Sentiments of the L<sup>d</sup>. Chancellor and of the L<sup>d</sup>. President of the Court therefore I have sent you the papers on that Subject which accompany this may be laid before them.
