pecuniary assistance if I did not stand
in need of it, but at this moment in

which my Soul is bowed down by affliction
 it is doubly painful to be oblig'd to
 think on pecuniary Affairs and still it
 is a duty, having no money in hand
 and a debt of near four thousand pounds
 to pay to the Heirs of my Husband, who
 he kindly lent me the Money which
 ever some Years ago I found myself
 under the necessity of raising.

Forgive my again speaking on this subject
 but have the goodness to give Baron de
 Himpfen a speedy answer as I am anxious
 at least to see how I can settle my
 Affairs. I also entreat you to renew
 the Trustees for my Fortune as I must
 now know to whom I am to apply to
