My joy at receiving the papers was very great, and as soon as I had finished your letter fell on my knees to thank God for his mercy to you and entrusted him to watch over you and those you love, granting them with you health happiness and many many years of every earthly bliss. Be convinced my beloved Adolphus that nobody loves you more dearly than me, or will ever be more sincerely attached to your children.

I am sorry that dear Augustus had so tedious
a labour, but hope she will take great care of
herself as by keeping quiet and avoiding every
fatigue I trust when she recovers she will
feel herself stronger than before her being in.
I pray for every thing kind and affectionate
to her in my name, and tell her, that I
do not wish to wish her joy, because I should
be afraid of being troublesome at such a
moment. But that I am quite delighted with
her being well and having a Son. You must
dear Dolly give him my blessing. Only think
of me remembering your birth as if it was
