It is with infinite Satisfaction that I learn from Mr. Grantham
not the Arrival of the Ratification of the French Preliminary
Articles, the expectation of the Spanish one in very few
days, and the Reception of the Dutch Plenipotentiaries to
the Suspension of Arms. I trust when either Mr. de Mevius
or Mr. de Montier may try to have the Articles of the
proposed Preliminaries with the Dutch made more
palatable to that Republic, that Mr. Grantham will
stand very stiffly to the Articles as they are already drawn
up, which they must accept though with a bad grace.

As Mr. d'Edhemar is to be nominated Ambassador to
this Court tomorrow, Mr. Grantham may certainly
acquaint Mr. Carleton and Mr. Foxwell that they
should be presented at the Levee on Monday.
