I cannot suffer this day's Post to leave Brunswick without offering by it my most heart felt Congratulation for the Providential escape you have had. I am most grateful for this signal interposition of Providence, in which must be our Trust for your preservation, it must ^{have} gratified you to see the proofs of uncommon attachment that you experienced from all ranks of your Subjects, the loss of you, at this time, and the horrid prospect they have to look forward to alarms everyone.
