My dearest brother

From not knowing that no letters are pre-
sented to you if they do not come in a cover to
Lieutenant Colonel Taylor, mine of the 9 of
this month I hear you have not receiv'd, not
can I trace what has been done with it, all
that I fear is that you should think me neglect-
ful of my acknowledgement for the Pension
that your goodness & kindness have bestow'd
upon me, that would hurt me exceedingly &
I trust that you do not doubt that my first wish
was to have come to thank you, that being contain'd
in the Enquette I wrote the instant I had the Duke
of Portland's letter, & this is the first I write in
my own House where I hope to give you a dinner.
