 Gent was sworn an Attorney in the Court of Record of the Honourable  
 Castle of Windsor the first day of March in the tenth year of the Reigne of the  
 late Queen our Over Great Britain &c. did also it appearing to me that the  
 said John Sawyer is duly qualified to act as an Attorney in the said Court  
 And he having this day taken before me the Oath appointed to be taken in the  
 roome of the Oath of Allegiance and Supremacy did also the Oath appointed  
 to be taken by Attorneys by an Act of Parliament made in the second year of  
 his present Majesties Reigne intituled an Act for the better regulation of  
 Attorneys and Solicitors. I do hereby admit him the said John Sawyer an  
 Attorney of the said Court and do hereby direct him to be enrolled by the  
 proper Officers of the said Court pursuant to the direction of the said Act.  
 Dated the 11th day of October in the fourth year of the Reigne of our  
 Soveraign Lord King George the second over Great Britain &c. Anno Dni 1730.
