

There being a Deficiency
of more than Three
Thousand Men in
the Marine Corps;

England or Ireland;
It is humbly submitted
to His Majesty whether

German Protestant
Soldiers, Deserters
from the Saxon &
Austrian Armies,
as it is apprehended
a number of those

People may be pre-
-vailed with to
enlist.

But as it is ne-
-cessary to employ
Yeoman Officers to
enlist those Defectors
into the Marine Corps,
who will expect to
be rewarded with
Commissions in His
Majesty's Service;
And as ^{they} cannot con-
-sistent with Act
of Parliament have
Commissions in the
Marine Corps; It

They may not have
 Commissions in that
 Battalion of the 60th
 or Roy^l American
 Regiment of Foot in
 America, which
 was originally
 intended to have
 only German or
 Swiss Officers, so
 soon as they shall
 have raised the
 Number of Men to
 be stipulated; it
 being apprehended
 that soon may be
 made for them in
 the abovemention'd
 Battalion, by re-
 moving into other

Regiments, the English
Officers that have
been appointed to
upon the death, or
removal of the Ger-
man or Swiss Officers
who were at first
appointed.
