

Extract of a Letter from Cap<sup>t</sup>  
 Dadds Comand<sup>r</sup> of His Ma<sup>ties</sup>  
 Ship the Dolphin to M<sup>r</sup> Burthott  
 Dated in Carlisle Bay July 19<sup>th</sup>  
 1728.

I am constrain'd to tell you that the  
 Spanish Guada Costa Sloop which I gave you  
 an Account of in my Letter of the 27<sup>th</sup> of June  
 last has taken One of our Ships going home  
 from Barbadoes as you will see by the  
 Enlosed Declaration.

It was the 12<sup>th</sup> of June at Seven in the  
 Evening when I receiv'd an Account of this  
 Sloop from the General of Martinico, but  
 did not know then she had taken any Vessel  
 or else I should have pursued her further  
 than I did.

Extract of a letter from the
