Sir,

I am extremely flattered with Your Majesty's gracious letter, and feel overjoyed that my House at Weymouth can be of any use to You. My Daughter, and I, had before this pretended paying our Duty at Windsor tomorrow, I shall then wish to suggest to Your Majesty that by adhaust as an Inn for a night, and Your Own House must be more eligible, than any other place; your Graces are very good Sir, in your heart about my Son, but either at Weymouth, or at Southampton I can place him for a few days without any trouble. I hear the Prussian Family are now not likely to come to England as they have orders to return to Berlin by the end of Sept^r for the several Weddings.
