Most Gracious Sovereign.

We Your Majesty's most Dutifull and Loyall Subjects, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament Assembled, beg Leave to return Your Majesty Our sincere Thanks, for Your most gracious Message, and humbly to assure Your Majesty, That having taken into Our Consideration the Proposal, contained in the Declaration made by the French Ambassador, by Order of His Court, of the fifth of this instant January, together with the Nature and State of the Accounts, which Your Majesty has been graciously pleased therewith to communicate to Us, and the Difficulties, and Delays, with which a compleat Examination and Settlement of them would probably be attended, We are humbly of Opinion, That it will be most adviseable for Your Majesty, to accept the Proposal, contained in the said Declaration of the French Ambassador, for the more speedy Satisfaction of Your Majesty's Demands, on the Court of France, for the Subsistance and Maintenance of French Prisoners of War.

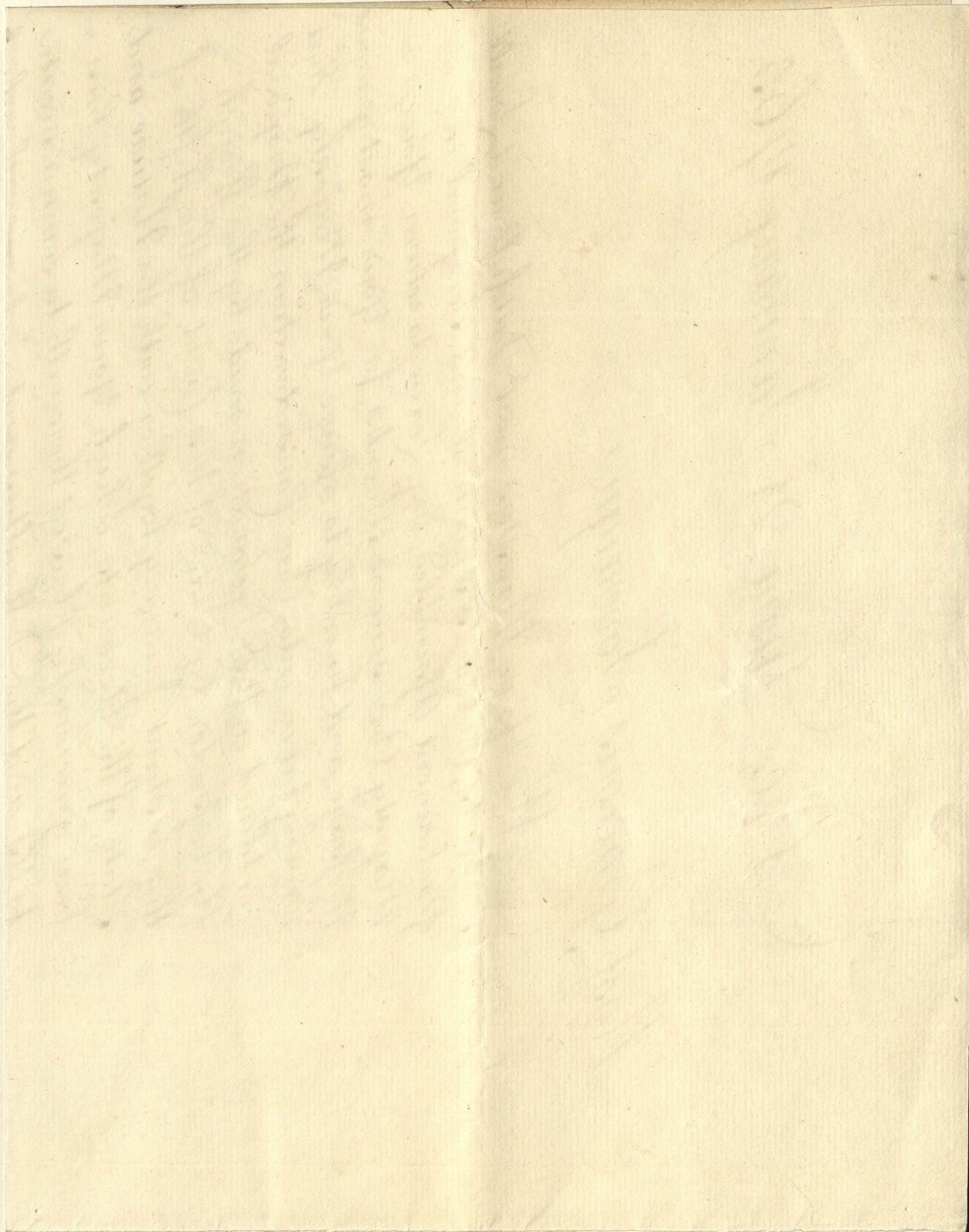
Order'd, That the said Address be presented to His Majesty by the Lords with white Staves.
