Lord Sandwich & Lord Halifax most dutifully acquaint his Majesty that after Lord Chancellor had declined being present at any Meeting last Night in consequence of the Message deliver'd to him by Lord Halifax, a Meeting was still propos'd: but Lord Mansfield and other Lords were of opinion that his Majesty's Wish with respect to the new propos'd Provision in Favour of the Princess of his Royal House, was not for many Reasons a Subject to be discuss'd at a Meeting of his Majesty's Servants.

Notwithstanding which, Lord Halifax in order to pay all possible Obedience to his Majesty's Intentions prevail'd on the Duke of Bedford, Lord Mansfield and Mr Grenville to meet us last Night: when we agreed that

The proper Method of executing his Majesty's
Commands relation to the Princes of Blood
would be by a Message from his Majesty on
Monday immediately after the Bill shall be read.

The only Reason why we took the Liberty
of requesting Leave to wait on his Majesty
this Day, was because no Minute was taken;
and we thought we could give his Majesty
greater Satisfaction by a Verbal Account of
what had passed.
