M^r. Smith had been Allowed when Nurse to the Princes
 Eldest Son 70^l & Ann Salary & 15^l & Week (39^l & Ann) for
 Board Wages and when discharged as Nurse the 70^l & Ann
 was settled on her as a Pension and being Employed
 as Laundress the same was paid her as a Salary but
 she had then no Board Wages but was Allowed at first
 50^l & Ann for Coals Candles & Laundry Rent and the
 Number of Children increasing on Application she was
 Allowed a further Yearly Sum of 40^l. she was also
 Allowed 6^l & Week each Child for the Portorage of the
 Trunks of Linnen to and from Leicester House, and her
 Bills for Washing Soap Blue Starch Lemons Thread Tape
 Buttons &c with that Portorage came to about 20^l & Month
 when the Children were Eight in Number
