Adjutant Generals' Office
Dublin 24th October 1800.

Whenever it shall be ascertained that the Enemy is off the Coast of Ireland, the several General Officers are hereby directed to place upon permanent Duty the whole of the Yeomanry Corps in the several Counties under their Command, (as detailed in the annexed Distribution,) with which, and the Regiments allotted for their protection, they are to make the best disposition for the tranquility of the same; as well as for the security of their several Communications.

Major General Myers at Cork, Major General Sir James Duff at Limerick, and Lieutenant General the Earl of Clanricarde at Loughrea Commanding in the West, are to forward to each other the earliest Information they may receive of the Enemy's Movements; as also to Head Quarters.

Lieutenant General the Earl of Clanricarde at Loughrea, Major General Trench at Ballina, and Brig.^d General Meyrick at Galway, will also communicate such Notice to Lieutenant General Gardiner at Armagh, and to Brigadier General Clephane at Enniskillen; and those Officers are in like manner to send to those Generals, whatever Information they may have of a similar Nature.

Brigadier General Clephane at Enniskillen, is also to communicate any Information he may obtain to Brig.^d Genl. Campbell at Londonderry, Lieutenant

Lieut^t General the Earl of Clanricarde at Loughrea, Brigadier General Meyrick at Galway, and Major General French at Ballina, as well as to Lieutenant General Gardiner at Armagh, and to Head Quarters.

Brigadier General Campbell at Londonderry will likewise communicate to Lieutenant General Gardiner at Armagh, Brig^d Genl. Clephane at Enniskillen, and to Head Quarters, such information as he may receive.

Major Generals Sir James Duff, Myers, & Sir Charles Asgill, will give the necessary directions for forming their respective Brigades in the South; Lieutenant General the Earl of Clanricarde the Brigade in the West, and Lieutenant General Gardiner the Brigades in the North.

The Horse Artillery at Mallow, Major Rogers' Brigade at Birr, and the Brigades of Irish Artillery nearest to the Points of Attack, (as the General Officers Commanding shall direct) are the only pieces of Ordnance that are to move without further directions.

The Regiments of Cavalry are so stationed, that a sufficient Number can be allotted for the Service required as the several Columns move to the point of Attack, & altho' many may be left at their present Quarters, the General Officers in making their Arrangements will bear in mind the eventual Movement of those Corps, as well as placing a sufficient force in such Towns where Depôts of any kind are formed, previous to the March of the Regts called upon to move from thence.

The General Officers will lose no time in transmitting to the Adjutant General, for His Excellency the Commander in Chief's information, such Arrangements for the protection

of the Districts under their Command, & for preserving their several Communications, as shall seem best to them, accompanied with the Observations & Suggestions, as from their local knowledge, they may wish to adopt.

Particular Care is to be taken that the allotted Number of Cows be within reach, and it will be expedient, in order to secure a supply of the fittest for the purpose, that the General Officers should consult and settle some mode, by which they may be obtained, with the Captains & Officers of the Yeomanry Corps in their Neighbourhoods.

Lieutenant General Dundas will direct a proper Officer to take charge of the Canal Communications from Hazel-hatch to Tullamore and Athy. — He will order Brig^{de} General Henniker to secure the Communication from Carlow to Kilkenny.

Lieutenant General Craig will give the necessary directions for the Safety of the Roads leading from Dublin to the North, & North West; the Canal as far as Hazel-hatch, & the Roads to Rathool & Arklow.

Major General Myers will give the necessary Orders for placing upon permanent Duty the Yeomanry of the County of Cork. — M^{aj}: Sir Jas^{ts} Duff that of the Counties of Limerick & Kerry. — M^{aj}: Sir C. Asgill that of the Counties of Tipperary & Kilkenny. — Lieut Gen^l Johnson that of the County of Waterford. — Lieut Gen^l Dundas the yeomanry of the Counties of Carlow, Kildare, Wexford, Kings & Queens. — Lieut Gen^l Craig the Counties of Dublin, South & Wicklow. — B^r: G. Barnett the C^os of Meath, Westmeath, & Longford. — L^{ieut}: G^{en}: the Earl Clanricarde the C^os of Clare, Galway, Mayo, & Roscommon. — Lieut Gen^l Gardiner the C^os of Sligo, Leitrim, Cavan, Fermanagh, Donegall, Londonderry, Tyrone, Antrim, Down, Armagh, & Monaghan.

As Lord Cornwallis will be able from the Head Quarters he may fix upon (after the Enemy's real Strength and Designs shall have been manifested) to direct the future Movements of the several Columns, a short Distance only has in this Sketch been pointed out to the several Generals commanding, when they will receive further Orders for their guidance.

A Return of the Married Women belonging to each Regiment, to be given in to the several Generals Commanding Brigades, signed by the Commandg Officers of Corps - when Four Pence per Day will be paid for their Subsistence - and Six Pence per Week for Lodging: - Government paying 2^d per day, & the other 2^d to be charged to the Mens Accounts."

The strictest injunctions are to be given by the General Officers Commanding Brigades, to prevent any Women from accompanying the Army on its March to meet the Enemy: They are to be left with the Heavy baggage, and the same Allowance as heretofore granted will be paid to them. (vide General Orders 29th August 1798, copied in the Margin.)

Lord Cornwallis considers the General Officers alone, responsible to Him for a due execution of this, as well as all other Orders; and desires that they will make such previous Arrangements, as shall leave nothing to be done after the Order to March shall arrive, but to prepare the necessary Cars, and move as directed.

On issuing the Order for Payment being made to the Women belonging to Regiments ordered to March against the Enemy; it must be specified, that the Officer in whose charge the Heavy Baggage shall be left, is to receive One Week's pay & Lodging Money for each Woman, from the Pay Master, with a Certified List of their names signed by the Commanding Officer of the Regiment; a Duplicate of which is also to be sent to the Agent, with Orders for the regular Weekly remittance specified therein, being sent to the Officer.

The Sum to be drawn for by the Agent in the manner he shall receive directions from the War Office, and for which he is instantly on the march of the Regiment to apply.
